Program or project description	The Back on Track program, which is a Northern Territory government initiative, aims to divert young people away from the youth justice system whilst providing one on one support for vulnerable young people aged 8 – 18 years and their families.
	In addition to providing intensive family and youth support to reconnect young people with their community and culture, the team focuses on creating pathways to formal vocational education / training for young people aged 14-18 whilst supporting children to remain with family, connected to country and supporting these children to remain connected to school.
	 Key focus areas are: Prevent children from being removed from their family and entering the Youth Justice system Work to improve school attendance of children Develop individual teaching plans that reflect and are attuned to the unique strengths and goals of each young person Support families to develop and implement strategies that directly support the health, safety and well-being of children and young people Work with parents to connect them to other services and specialised providers as identified and required
	Bicultural participation is at the heart of our service delivery. We are committed to co-working arrangements, where our local Aboriginal staff and non-Aboriginal practitioners share a caseload, and offer a practice model that respectfully engages clients and provides peer support for the practitioners.
