	Home Interaction Program for Parents and Youngsters (HIPPY) is a two-year home-based early childhood enrichment program for families with a 3-5-year-old child. HIPPY builds the confidence and skills of parents and carers to create a positive learning environment to prepare their child for school. HIPPY is delivered through a mix of home visits and parent groups.
	HIPPY empowers families to be their child's first teacher. Families receive free activity packs and storybooks. A trained Home Tutor helps parents and carers to complete the activities. The Program is managed by a HIPPY Coordinator and Home Tutors. The benefits to children are that the program encourages a love of learning; prepares children for school; promotes language and listening, builds self-esteem and confidence and increases positive experiences at school.
	The benefits to parents are the program supports families create a learning environment at home; increases knowledge of how children learn; and allows families to enjoy fun, learning time with children.
