Smalltalk helps parents to become aware of the importance of the everyday interactions they have with their child.
	There are currently five Smalltalk Supported Playgroups which are delivered across the Latrobe Valley. They operate on the basis that 8-10 families are enrolled in each Supported Playgroup each term.
	The playgroups feature parenting interventions which aim to create positive home learning environments by supporting families to facilitate their children's learning. The interventions build on existing parenting strengths, enabling parents to be more knowledgeable and confident in their own abilities to meet their parenting responsibilities. The interventions also incorporate strategies that help parents meet their own needs, both individually and as a parent.
