- Prepare and review balance sheet reconciliations
- Identify and implement finance process improvement initiatives, including opportunities for automation, and ensure finance processes are well documented
- Provide support to our Pacific Country Office finance teams for balance sheet review and reconciliation preparation
- Perform ad-hoc projects allocated from the Deputy Financial Controller and/or Financial Controller, in line with organisational objectives
- Contribute to the maintenance of operational Finance manuals and documentation of the Internal Control Framework
