Context of Consultancy – Background on Project

SOLKAS is a partnership between the Government of the Solomon Islands, through the Ministry of Environment, Climate Change, Disaster Management, and Meteorology (MECDM), and Save the Children Solomon Islands (SCSI). It is one of the largest locally led adaptation projects globally with a strong focus on community adaptation linking youth engagement and entrepreneurship. Largely funded under the Green Climate Fund (GCF) with co-finance from the governments of Australia, New Zealand and the Solomon Islands, it has been designed to reduce children, youth and communities' exposure to climate hazards and help build sustainable, resilient communities and livelihoods in the context of climate change. Working with communities across six provinces, the project will strengthen resilience to climate change impacts by strengthening the capacities of national, subnational, and local governments, communities, and schools to understand, plan for and implement responses to the climate crisis. Working closely with Ministries (Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Disaster Management (MECDM), Ministry of Education and Human Resource Development (MEHRD), Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock (MAL), Ministry of Provincial Government and Institutional Strengthening (MPGIS), Ministry of Fisheries and Marine Resources (MFMR), Ministry of Rural Development (MRD) and Ministry of Women, Youth, Children and Family Affairs (MWYCFA), the project will achieve this through activities under three components:

- 1. Community-led development of adaptation plans, climate change knowledge and skills, and access to climate change information.
- 2. Resilient livelihoods, food and nutrition security, and school-level infrastructure; and
- 3. Institutional strengthening.

Specifically, this consultancy will contribute to the following related project outputs:

Output 1.3 Youth have increased skills for resilient livelihoods

This output and activity area focuses on increasing youth engagement and leadership roles in various levels of governance, including community, ward, and provincial levels. It emphasizes the involvement of youth in decision-making processes, particularly through the VDCRC's connection to ward development committees. Additionally, it seeks to create opportunities for youth to enhance their engagement in livelihood and entrepreneurship initiatives. Moreover, the activity intends to look at finding opportunity to support youth to develop skills and implement resilient livelihood.

Output 2.4: Targeted youth develop sustainable livelihood opportunities

In alignment with Output 1.3, which focuses on increasing youth skills and understanding of resilient livelihoods, support is provided through the establishment and scaling up of youth climate-resilient livelihood incubator models. An initial assessment and scoping were conducted in collaboration with the private sector to explore livelihood and entrepreneurship options. As a result, an incubator model was developed with the goal of having 150 youth incubators actively managed within the targeted communities. These models undergo a process where business ideas are presented to evaluate their viability, inclusiveness, and potential for sustainability. Additionally, matchmaking with like-minded private sector partners is facilitated to provide mentorship, further advancing the sustainability and profitability of the initiatives.

Save the Children SOLKAS Project seeks a consultant to work collaboratively with the Ministry of Rural Development (MRD), youth networks, implementing ministries and SOLKAS Project Management Unit



(PMU) to support and lead the scoping, research, recommendation and development of training materials for youth in target communities.

Scope of Consultancy and Timeframes

The consultancy is to be delivered in up to 30 consulting days over a 5 month period (October 2024 – March 2025). The following are essential elements within the consultancy approach and methodology to be delivered according to the following timeline.

With support and guidance from SOLKAS project management unit, key staff from the seven implementing ministries including relevant SOLKAS Ministry embedded staff, the consultant is expected to deliver on the following:

Youth Livelihoods Research and Scoping:

- Undertake desk-based literature review and key informant interviews to collect and analyse relevant information and data on viable businesses targeting youth as it relates to markets, value chain, opportunities and the capabilities of the private sectors on social development entrepreneurship and best practices in the region
- Assess how youth development is governed, including the role of rural training centres, and examine
 how they have been supported in engaging with entrepreneurship. What challenges and opportunities
 exist to model and sustain youth engagement with the private sector in resilient livelihood business
 opportunities

Specific activity areas the consultancy will contribute to include but not limited to the following:

- Working with the Young Entrepreneurs Council Solomon Islands and government operated Rural Training Centers, like minded
 private sectors and other providers, youth in targeted villages will be supported to develop the skills they will need to pursue
 resilient livelihoods as climate change impacts escalate (2024)
- Initial and ongoing assessment of private sector to assess opportunities to link with youth entrepreneurs for livelihood resilience (2024)
- Review of existing training packages in Solomon Islands and the region targeted at appropriate and relevant climate resilient rural livelihoods skills development, with emphasis on climate resilience and business management, especially financial management, marketing, and digital solutions (2024)

Youth Engagement in Climate Adaptation Planning

Support youth to effectively engage with local level adaptation planning processes:

- Assess, review and make recommendations about existing training packages in Solomon Islands and the region targeted at appropriate and relevant climate resilient rural livelihoods, skills development, with emphasis on climate resilience and business management especially financial management, marketing and digital solution
- Building on the work of 2024 and the above, specific activity areas the consultancy will develop 'flipped classroom' and 'micro learning' model trainings on key issues (including climate- resilient agriculture, fisheries and livestock processes, food preservation and processing, natural resource management and nature-based solutions, non-timber forest product development, native cash cropping, etc., (2024-2025)

Expected travel: Local travel to a pre-agreed provinces is envisaged to support implementation and monitoring activities, with travel costs covered by consultant and reimbursed, or SOLKAS PMU in accordance with available budget pre-agreed before travel.

- Excellent project management, advocacy and diplomatic skills to enable effective engagement and responses with stakeholders. Experience with approaches to school safety / climate change adaptation / mitigation, including Disaster Risk Reduction or hazard management in schools
