Here you'll make a difference

At Save the Children Australia, we attract bright and big-hearted people who are inspired to make a difference. Together, we are fearless in our pursuit of making lasting change for the children and communities who need it most.

The Climate Change Adviser provides high quality technical input on climate change Project Ideas, Concept Notes and Funding Proposals, to Save the Children's climate change portfolio globally to support the development, approval and implementation of projects. The role works with key stakeholders across the Save the Children global confederation (largely Country Offices and Members), government counterparts and international organisations, providing technical analysis, advice and capacity building to ensure that context specific needs are considered and best adaptation practices are applied contributing to strengthening the climate resilience of children, women and men in remote settings. Through this role, Save the Children aims to support as much as possible, locally-led and age responsive approaches that enable communities and their governments to adapt to the impacts of climate change and to future risks.

The Portfolio

The current CCD portfolio consists of Green Climate Fund (GCF) Projects and the Global Partnership for Education (GPE) funded Climate Smart Education System Initiative (CSESI).

The Green Climate Fund accredited Save the Children Australia on behalf of the SC movement in November 2019 allowing us to submit proposals of up to USD50 million each (inclusive of co-finance) on a rolling basis. Our partnerships with GCF is enabling us to deliver impact at scale for children, provides access and evidence for advocacy and cement's SC's credibility as a leader in climate for children, drawing in additional climate partnerships (such as that with GPE). As of November 2024, Save the Children's GCF portfolio includes 11 projects valued at around USD 360 million including co-financing. Two projects are under implementation (Vanuatu and Solomon Islands) with a further four approved (Laos, Sierra Leone, Mozambique, Malawi). Two have been submitted to the GCF for review (Mali and BRACE - a multi-country education project) and three are being developed (Senegal, Zimbabwe, Somalia).

The Climate Smart Education Systems, Strategic Capability Initiative (CSESI) is a USD 21 million initiative that was launched by the Global Partnership for Education in June 2023 and seek to enhance countries' capacities to mainstream climate change adaptation and environmental sustainability into education sector plans, budgets and strategies as well as to enhance education ministry capacity for cross-sectoral coordination on climate and environment-related policy and programming. Save the Children were selected alongside UNESCO and UNESCO's International Education Planning institute (IIEP) to deliver this technical assistance project across 35 countries in Affrica, Asia and the Small Islands Developing Strategies (SIDS). The project will run to Dec 2026 and include a midterm and final evaluation.

Research, analysis and applied knowledge

- Develop templates, visuals and tools to support GCF project teams based on refined understanding of climate change context and adaptation benefits
- Support pipeline analysis to enable understanding of impact, gaps and continued improvement
- Analyse wider GCF portfolio (or other multi-lateral funders) for in-house use and comparisons, when requested
- Assess and synthesise climate change reports, studies and documentation of practice for integration into project formulation.
- Evaluate sectoral/thematic emerging trends related to climate change/climate finance, when requested e.g. health, education, food and water security, risk financing, digital innovation, financial innovation etc.

Relationship and capacity building

- Liaise with relevant GCF staff, in particular Task Managers
- Support Country Offices to develop relationships with NDAs where needed
- Participate in relevant Save the Children Technical Working Groups and represent Save the Children's work in relevant events/forums
- Support capacity building and increase knowledge and understanding of climate change, adaptation benefits and justification for climate financing in GCF project teams (including country offices, members and local partners e.g. DAE's) to inform programming and advocacy.

Essential knowledge or experience

- Experience of developing concept notes and funding proposals for GCF, GEF and/or Adaptation Fund
- Experience in researching, analysing and drafting climate change evidence and building appropriate solutions, with an understanding of how to interpret scientific literature and climate models, in addition to sourcing most relevant climate information
- Experience designing and implementing contextualised climate change approaches, standards, tools, guidelines etc., with accountability and participation
- Experience in developing and applying climate change adaptation and mitigation practices at the national and/or sub-national level
- High-level of attention to detail when drafting and reviewing text and when interpreting images
- Strong interpersonal, collaborative, networking, and relationship-building skills across cultures
- Strong analytical skills and the ability to synthesise and process information on development and climate change issues
- Strong verbal and written communication skills, including engaging presentation skills and the ability to synthesise complex information
- Demonstrated project management skills and remote/hybrid work skills
- Demonstrated strategic planning skills, and strong time management, administrative and organisational skills
- Sound knowledge of inclusive programming approaches, including integrating gender equality and social inclusion into climate change projects
- Ability to problem-solve, multi-task, determine priorities, take the initiative, and work collaboratively with a team, as well as independently
- Sound understanding and experience of child rights-based approach to development
- Flexibility in a fast-moving context where priorities can rapidly change
- Advanced IT proficiency, e.g., MS Suite, CRM.

Desirable knowledge or experience

- Experience of working in an INGO setting
- Willingness to plan and lead bespoke training and capacity development initiatives for distinct cohorts
- Demonstrated application of climate modelling
- Proven ability to work in remote teams, across cultures and independently
- Willingness to travel as and when required
