At Save the Children Australia, we attract bright and big-hearted people who are inspired to make a difference. Together, we are fearless in our pursuit of making lasting change for the children and communities who need it most.

Reporting to the Pacific Regional Program Development and Quality Director, the Health and Nutrition Technical Advisor provides intensive technical support and strategic guidance for health and nutrition programming across Save the Children Country offices in the Pacific, including Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu and Tonga. Through this role, Save the Children aims to significantly expand the portfolio of work to deliver quality outcomes for children.

The Health and Nutrition Advisor will work to build and strengthen health and nutrition programs and staff capacity across the region. This includes advancing each country's health and nutrition strategic goals, establishing and strengthening donor relationships, leading on the design of health and nutrition programs (in development and emergency contexts), guiding and supporting program staff to initiate planned interventions, and working closely with national and provincial health and nutrition stakeholders to coordinate and provide effective, timely and coordinated responses to health and nutrition needs. The position will work closely with the program development and operations teams in facilitating the planning, implementation, and monitoring of health and nutrition programs. Externally, the role will be expected to work strategically with national ministries and other relevant sectors to position Save the Children as a leading provider of life changing maternal child health and nutrition interventions for families and communities.

The role requires high level technical knowledge of public health and nutrition to support strategic planning, business development, reviewing/developing evidence-informed, contextually relevant health and nutrition programs and identifying and supporting the implementation of appropriate implementation modalities.

In the event of a major humanitarian emergency, the role holder will be expected to work outside the normal role profile and be able to vary working hours accordingly.

Role requirements

Strategic Program Development

- Identify opportunities to grow and strengthen the health and nutrition portfolio across the Pacific, including identification of future partners and areas of programming.
- Support and monitor the strategic direction of health and nutrition programs, playing a significant role in monitoring results, and aligning programs with SCA and SC global strategies and results architecture.
- Maintain oversight of program portfolios and ensure alignment with Country Office CSPs.
- Establish and strength donor relationships and position Save the Children for funding from diverse range of donors.

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- Lead and work in collaboration with relevant SC/partner staff to develop funding strategies and proposals to expand the health and nutrition portfolio in line with strategic priorities and technical best practice from a range of sources. This will involve continuously developing concepts and innovations and packaging them for a range of donors, both for proactive and reactive fundraising efforts.
- Identify and pursue opportunities for integrated programs to address the holistic needs of children, especially the most vulnerable.
- Ensure multi-thematic approaches to program design and methodologies; ensure that cross thematic objectives (Gender Equity, disability and Social Inclusion, Disaster Risk Reduction, Child Participation and child rights programming) are included in program design and monitoring.
- Support development and implementation of health and nutrition research, including seeking new funding opportunities and providing strategic inputs to proposals in the development stage.
- Humanitarian preparedness: Support the development of scenario-based country-specific preparedness plans, including identification of health response triggers and health response plans.

Coordination and Representation

- Work with a range of partners and stakeholders to ensure SC's contributions to health and nutrition are in line with the national nutrition, donor and Save the Children priorities.
- Represent Save the Children in national health and nutrition community engagement including government, donors, partners, I/NGOs and CSOs., including coordinating with national nutrition initiatives and partners (e.g. SUN CSA).
- Coordinate and ensure participation of Save the Children in the celebration of key international and national health related days.
- Maintain excellent relationships with donors, both in terms of strategic positioning and program delivery
- Represent the Pacific in Save the Children International networks and meetings including at the Asia region, with members and other Country offices
- Lead in defining Save the Children's advocacy agenda in the health & nutrition sector, as informed by SC's experience in the Pacific. Lead in networking and articulating Save the Children's position, policy and strategy in national forums and meetings. Engage in key debates related to national health & nutrition sector policies and programs, in coordination with other technical colleagues and other relevant staff.

Technical Leadership

- Lead in the development of technical outputs and training materials necessary for the effective delivery of health and nutrition programs. Technical input should be aligned with SC Global Health and Nutrition strategic approaches, where relevant.
- Facilitate relevant trainings as needed and build technical capacities of project team members through mentoring and coaching.
- Provide technical support to multi-sectoral implementation teams through programme visits, review reports and joining of technical review meetings
- Support, in coordination with the MEAL and health and nutrition Project Managers, the
 development, implementation and monitoring of quality benchmarks and MEAL frameworks, as
 well as supporting the monitoring of outcomes and developing lessons learned
- Lead the contextualization of Save the Children common approaches, including Treating
 Children Close to Home, Nourishing the Youngest, My Sexual Health and Rights, among others,
 and ensure their implementation with fidelity and build staff capacity as needed
- Collaborate with child protection technical advisers to ensure child protection, child safeguarding and child participation is integrated into all health and nutrition program design and program operations
- Support health and nutrition programme teams and MEAL advisors in development and submission of quality health and nutrition reports to donors, government and health and nutrition stakeholders.

- Document and facilitate the sharing of experience and learning across the Pacific and the wider sector
- Share relevant global policy and programming lessons relating to health and nutrition across Pacific Offices

- Advanced understanding of the Pacific health sector especially working with national and provincial health authorities
- Experience managing large, complex health and nutrition programs in the Pacific with multiple stakeholders and implementing partners
- Experience in coordinating maternal child health and nutrition programs with national and provincial health authorities, NGOs, UN Agencies, institutions and development partners involved in maternal child health and nutrition programs.
- Experience in advocating for effective maternal child health and nutrition interventions/strategies at the national level.
- Ability to produce high quality organization and donor reports in English for dissemination and publication.
- Experience with qualitative and quantitative data analysis and management methods and tools
- Knowledge and experience relating to Save the Children's Common Approaches highly desirable
