Your insights will equip relationship managers with what they need to build and cultivate strategic partnerships.

Role requirements

- Develop and implement an annual prospect development plan aligned with organisational funding priorities.
- Use proactive and data-driven methodologies to identify, qualify, and prioritise prospective donors across high net-worth individuals, trusts and foundations, and corporate partners.
- Conduct in-depth research using biographical, financial, philanthropic, and media sources to produce high-quality profiles, briefings, and strategic insights.
- Undertake due diligence on prospective and existing donors to support ethical fundraising and reputational risk management.
- Collaborate with relationship managers to guide portfolio reviews and donor strategy meetings, helping shape cultivation, solicitation and stewardship plans.
- Monitor and refine prospect pipelines, ensuring timely integration of data into the Donor Management Platform (Microsoft Dynamics) for accurate reporting and forecasting.
- Maintain comprehensive and confidential records of research activities, ensuring data accuracy and compliance with privacy regulations.
- Support the development and implementation of prospect management policies, procedures, and training resources.
- Respond to research requests from relationship managers and senior leadership, providing tailored intelligence for donor meetings, events, and board engagement.
- Build strong internal relationships across philanthropy and corporate partnerships teams to ensure alignment and shared understanding of donor opportunities.
- Stay informed of philanthropic trends, tools, and innovations through engagement with the global Save the Children network and external research communities.
- Contribute to continuous improvement by evaluating research practices and integrating sector-leading approaches.

Essential knowledge or experience

- Minimum 3 years' experience in qualitative research, prospect development, or fundraising intelligence within a nonprofit organisation or university.
- Strong analytical skills, with the ability to interpret complex data, identify giving patterns, and generate actionable insights.
- High level of intellectual curiosity and persistence, with a proactive approach to sourcing and evaluating information.
- Demonstrated judgement and discretion in handling confidential donor information and conducting ethical due diligence and reputational risk assessments.
- Exceptional written and verbal communication skills, with the ability to produce clear, concise, and compelling donor profiles, briefings, and reports.
- Proficiency in donor databases and research tools, such as Microsoft Dynamics, WealthX, or equivalent platforms.
- Excellent time and project management abilities, with a proven track record of meeting deadlines and managing competing priorities.
- Strong interpersonal skills, with the ability to collaborate across teams and build rapport with internal stakeholders.

Desirable knowledge or experience

- Experience implementing prospect management systems, including strategies to track and engage prospects throughout the donor lifecycle
- Knowledge of the philanthropic landscape and global development sector, with an understanding of ethical research standards, data privacy, and fundraising best practices
